I wanted to let you know that you are being thought of today.

This kind of message seems to accomplish exactly what I hope happens. It is something of a verbal greeting card with the sound of my voice and thoughts of remembering them, being sent.

Our group welcomes all veterans, and their support systems, no matter who they are. We meet in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesdays of the month, at the Post, at 5:30-about 7:00 or 7:30. We also have lots of pizza, pop, and something for dessert sometimes.
